

One big installation

Selangor Sultan unveils water art

ONE KL, touted as Malaysia's most exclusive condominium when it was launched, now has *Infinite*, a work of art by artist Baet Yeok Kuan to boast of.

Located in the lobby directly facing the entrance, *Infinite* consists of 288 silver water drops in six different sizes.

Each is designed to resemble a drop of water and together they form a curtain of cascading silver droplets on the wall behind the reception desk.

"It took a year to formalise and six months to complete and install the project," said Baet. Around 60 house owners and VIPs turned

up for the unveiling ceremony by Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah of Selangor in the presence of the Regent of Perak Raja Nazrin Shah.

"One KL was created to be Kuala Lumpur's most unique residential building. It has one private pool for each condo plus a large community pool. There is also a fountain at the entrance. Based on the water theme, we decided to commission Baet to create a water-inspired installation," said developer One KLCC Sdn Bhd managing director Carmen Chua.

To unveil the installation, Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah pressed a remote control to remove the black cloth and revealed *Infinite* as guests clapped.

"It is great. I like it," he said as Raja Nazrin nodded in agreement.
